



NEMSPA Pilot-of-the-Year (POY) guidelines

The National EMS Pilots Association Pilot of the Year (NEMSPA POY) Award is presented to recognize superior performance of an Emergency Medical Services Pilot and his/her contributions to the broader air medical community as exhibited during the award period.

ELIGIBILITY:

Any and all EMS Pilots that hold an FAA Certificate and are currently employed by an EMS provider for work that supports patient transport services and/or actively “flying the line” (Rotary or Fixed Wing). Current membership in NEMSPA is not required for eligibility and consideration for the award.

CRITERIA:

The most outstanding contribution to Emergency Medical Services through Leadership and Mentoring, Technical Knowledge and Expertise, Contributions to Aviation or Transport Safety, and/or Overall Personal Professionalism. When nominating individuals consideration should be given to the aforementioned merits of this award in respect to either a contributory single event or sustained superior performance during the specified award period. The NEMSPA POY is not designed to be a “statement of pilot popularity” or an avenue for recognition of “lifetime achievements”.

PERIOD:

The award period covers the calendar year (twelve months) that immediately precedes the nomination deadline.

SELECTION/PRESENTATION:

Selection made by NEMSPA Board of Directors and presented at the annual Air Medical Transportation Conference symposium and awards dinner.

NOMINATION DUE DATE:

Application deadline is **15 August 2015**. Late applications will be reviewed on a case by case basis and hold no guarantee for consideration.
